At Odense ZOO we have more than 2,000 animals from around the world: Discover the elegant giraffes and antelopes in the African Kiwara and hear the beautiful Siberian tigers roam among lively macaques and lazy red pandas. Experience tropical rains among the endangered tapirs and giant manatees – and chill with the penguins.

The island of Fyn is known as “the Garden of Denmark” on account of its fertile soil. This gives rise to a wealth of seasonal produce and specialities, which you can enjoy in Odense’s numerous and varied cafés and restaurants.

Odense is only about 1½ hours away from Copenhagen Airport (frequent direct train connections). It is therefore easy to combine your trip with a short visit to the capital of Denmark.
