Status on institution accreditation: End January 2014, SDU submitted its self-evaluation report, which outlines the quality system and quality policy of the university. The first visit from the accreditation panel is 1-2 April, where they will meet with a number of employee groups and stakeholders. II. MOOC (Massive open online course) The university will initiate a number of tests with MOOC in order to gain experience with new digital forms of learning. Anders Brandt has been awarded funding from the e-learning funds for lessons with flipped classroom. The experience of using the time in the class room for exercises and problem solving while the theoretical part is recorded and available online is positive. At the next meeting of the Academic Council, Henning Andersen will go through the MOOC activities, which has been initiated at TEK and SDU. III. SDU's revised language policy Two elements are at the centre of SDU's language policy. 1) In the future employees who conduct their teaching in English must be certified. Evaluated according to the international classification C1. The first certification teams have already started. 2) Danish lessons for international employees. They must not be certified but after a while they must be able to receive and understand emails/documents in Danish. After two years of employment, international employees are expected to have achieved sufficient Danish language skills to be able to participate in everyday activities of the university. b. Following, TEK's own reserves amounts to approx. 39 million Danish kroner. For 2014, TEK has budgeted a deficit of 12 million. However, the actual			
	number is expected to be smaller.			
	The new budget pamphlet was handed out. The pamphlet should be regarded as an expression of SDU's increased visibility and transparency in economy management.

	If all basic funds were allocated through the performance model approx. half a billion were to be reallocated from the old universities to the new regional universities.
	At SDU basic funds for research are not allocated equally between the faculties either – likewise a historical allocation in favour of the 'old' faculties.
	Review of TEK's research appropriation allocated according to basic and external funds and according to departments.
