A Risk Assessment Study of the Proposed Greenfield International Airport Project in West Bengal, India

On the basis of a concrete example from West Bengal in India, Dr. Prasenjit Maiti will discuss how to apply risk assessment studies. The example is the effort to establish a private, greenfield airport. This implies statutory risks, technology risks, environmental risks, social risks, commercial, operational and maintenance risks. Among other general debates, the example points at the difficult balance in India's developmental strategy between development and displacement of people and between capital interests and liberal democracy.

Dr. Maiti is at the moment guest researcher at the Danish Institute of Rural Research, SDU, Esbjerg. He is a trained political sociologist and has worked at Burdwan University, Fribourg University in Switzerland, Heidelberg in Germany. After some years working for NGOs, he is now project manager at CES (Consulting Engineering Services) which is one of the biggest consulting companies in South East Asia. In 2005 he published the book Development Discourses and he has edited four volumes on Urban Development Debates.
