## Notes for Contributors:

Each manuscript should be preceded by an abstract in English of about 100 words (even if the manuscript is submitted in another language). Manuscripts should be in double spacing, with wide margins, preferably A4 size.

Only single quotation marks should be used except for quotes within quotes, which must be given in double quotation marks. Quotes of more than two lines should be indented five spaces and not given quotation marks. If the second of a pair of quotation marks stands at the same point as another mark of punctuation, the quotation mark precedes unless the other mark is itself part of the quoted matter. Glosses are given in single quotation marks, while cited forms (letters, words, phrases, or sentences) are italicized (underlined) in the text. Reference to a publication should be given as 'Author year: page-number', e.g. 'Foucault 1980:118'. If the author's name is part of the text, use this form: 'Foucault (1980:118) talks of how...'

The author's address appears at the end of the article (but before the notes and the list of references). All notes should be numbered consecutively and gathered after the main text. They must be typed with double spacing. The bibliography, which must also be double-spaced, should have the form shown in the following examples:
