Building Nations, Making Worlds, Creating Subjects: European Languages in Postcolonial Africa

How can we understand the history of European languages in postcolonial Africa? Half of all African countries today designate English as an official language; Angolans who speak Portuguese at home outnumber the Portuguese in Portugal itself; and Kinshasa now has more French speakers than Paris. Of course, these facts alone tell us little without proper contextualization, but they provoke a wide array of questions concerning the histories of colonization, decolonization, and globalization.

Christoph Kalter is Professor of History at the University of Agder in Kristiansand, Norway. He is the author of The Discovery of the Third World. Decolonization and the Rise of the New Left in France, c. 1950-1976 (CUP, 2016) and Postcolonial People. The Return from Africa and the Remaking of Portugal (CUP, 2022).
