## INTRODUCTION

This catalogue contains descriptions and illustrations of the entire vase collection in the Odense University. It was dr.phil. I. Strøm, the head of the Department of Classical Archaeology, who shortly after the Odense University had been established in 1966 took the initiative to start building up a collection of antiquities to provide a study collection for students of Classical archaeology.

In 1967 OUKL 1–3 were acquired in Denmark with the information that the objects had been bought in Nicosia from an antiquities dealer who claimed that some of them had been found at Lapithos. In 1969 and 1970 OUKL 4 and 6 were purchased from art dealers; OUKL 6 with economic support from the N.M. Knudsen Foundation. The larger part of the collection was bought in 1971 in Denmark and comprises most of the Cypriote vases. In 1973 the Fyns Stiftmuseum deposited OUKL 402–404, 407, 409, 411, 415–423 and 425 at the University; these are of unknown provenance but probably not from Cyprus. In 1974 OUKL 501 was given to the university by Dr Ingrid Strøm, according to whom it was obtained in Greece. It is not known how OUKL 354 and OUKL 358 were acquired.

Steps towards publishing the collection were taken in 1978 by I. Strøm, to whom the authors are much indebted for taking this initiative. In the same year a grant from the Board of Humanistic Sciences enabled the start of the work. A grant from the Carlsberg Foundation in 1981 ensured the completion of the catalogue. Anne Marie Nielsen and Lone Wriedt Sørensen are most grateful to both foundations. They also wish to express their thanks to the lecturer M. Leisner-Jensen and dr.phil. J. Isager, Department of Greek and Roman Studies, Odense University, for helping them with many trivial matters and the staff of the photographic laboratory, Odense University, for producing the photographic material. The undergraduates Mette C. Hermannsen and Mia Jacobsen ensured the completion of the work at Odense. Prof. P. Åström received the manuscript in 1999 for publication as a volume in the SIMA series.

Anne Marie Nielsen is responsible for section A: The Cypriote Bronze Age pottery and Lone Wriedt Sørensen for section B: The Cypriote Iron Age pottery and section C: The Greek pottery. The manuscript was finished in 1982. The text has been revised, updated and edited by Karin Nys and Paul Åström, who thank dr J. Isager for kind assistance during their study of the collection in Odense and Helene Blinkenberg Hastrup for providing additional information.

Relative dates have been suggested for the Cypriote Bronze Age items in Section A and absolute dates for the Greek pottery in Section C; for the time span of the Iron Age wares see SCE IV:2, 202–203.

The vases from Odense will be included in the indices of Corpus of Cypriote Antiquities 23, Cypriote Antiquities in Denmark, where some further information about the Cypriote collection in Odense will be given.

# SECTION A: THE CYPRIOTE BRONZE AGE POTTERY

## A.1. Jug, Type I A<sup>1</sup>h. OUKL 42. Pl. 1.1.

H 22.0 cm, D 12.0 cm.

Intact. On the body below the handle the clay has disintegrated, and the reminder of the surface is rather worn.

The clay is brownish-buff and coarse. The slip is lustrous reddish-brown.

Ovoid body, knobbed base. The cut-away neck is narrow and slightly conical. Handle, oval in section, from rim to shoulder

Red Polished I-II (EC I late - EC II).

Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. LXI; Frankel 1983, 54, no. 304, pl. 21; Stewart 1988, 25, Type I A<sup>th</sup>.

## A.2. Jug, Type I A<sup>1</sup>j. OUKL 40. Pl. 1.2.

H 29.5 cm, D 16.6 cm.

Intact, except for disintegration of the clay and fractures below the handle and above the bottom. The surface is very worn, and the slip is mainly preserved on the upper parts of the body.

The clay is yellowish-buff, and it is coarse with large particles. The slip is warm red.

Elliptical body ending in a thick knob. Slightly conical, cut-away neck. Handle, oval in section, from rim to shoulder. On the handle are two pairs of incised vertical strokes. Red Polished I–II (EC II).

Cf. SCE IV:IA, pl. LXII:1; Stewart 1988, 26, Type I A'i.

# **A.3. Jug, Type I A<sup>1</sup>j.** without inv. no. Pl. 1.3.

H 47.5 cm, D 20.0 cm.

Upper part of neck missing, otherwise intact. On the upper part of the handle and neck the slip has peeled off.

The clay is greyish-buff with a dark grey core and dark particles. The slip is brownish-red changing into orangered in patches.

Elliptical body, conical neck. Groove on the transition from neck to body. Handle, oval in section, from neck to body. RP II—III (probably EC II).

Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. LXII:2-3; Stewart 1988, 26, Type I A<sup>1</sup>j.

## A.4. Jug, Type I B1b2. OUKL 39. Pl. 1.4.

H 40.0 cm, D 26.5 cm.

The rim is missing, and the surface is very worn.

The clay is reddish-brown with minor particles. The slip is warm brownish-red.

Ovoid body. Concave neck and everted rim. Handle, round in section, from neck to shoulder. On the shoulder, opposite the handle side, is a horseshoe or reversed U in relief. A knob on each side of the body.

Red Polished III (end of EC II – EC III).

Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. LXXVI:3; Stewart 1988, 63, Type I B<sup>15</sup>b2.

## A.5. Jug, Type I B1bb2. OUKL 38. Pl. 1.5.

H 46.0 cm, D 36.0 cm, D of mouth 10.0 cm.

Parts of the rim are missing. The surface is very worn, and the slip and the surface itself has disintegrated in large patches.

The clay is yellowish-buff with a grey core; it is rather porous with lighter and darker particles. The slip is reddish-brown.

Globular body, cylindrical neck with flaring rim. Handle, oval in section, from neck to shoulder. On the neck, opposite the handle side, an incised, vertical, triple zigzag; three impressed holes at the ends and at the turns of the zigzag. Above the handle a single chevron with three groups of three holes. On the handle a triple zigzag.

Red Polished III (end of EC II - EC III).

Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. LXXVI:4, 12. The decoration resembles SCE IV:1A, fig. LXXXVIII:5. The zigzag is a vertical variation of Morris 1985, 296, fig. 512, no. 69 "dot-capped zigzag"; Stewart 1988, 63, Type I B<sup>Ib</sup>b2.

# **A.6. Jug, Type I B<sup>2</sup>i2.** OUKL 1. Pl. 1.6.

H 41.0 cm, D 22.9 cm.

Handle as well as most of the rim missing. The surface is very worn, and the slip has completely disappeared from large parts.

The clay is yellowish-buff with a grey core. The slip is a warm dark lustrous red.

Ovoid body, slim slightly conical neck and flaring rim. Traces of a handle from lower neck to shoulder. On the transition from neck to shoulder a relief band with regular depressions, and opposite the handle this band is interrupted by the broken off base of a horizontally perforated knob. On the shoulder three groups of three horizontal, parallel relief bands with regular depressions. On the upper part of the neck two horizontal relief bands. From just under the rim three vertical incised zigzags fall straight down to the ornaments on the shoulder, and another falls down to the handle. Below the handle two short, vertical, incised zigzags.

Red Polished III (MC I).

Cf. SCE I, pl. XXXVII:1, row 1:1, Tomb 322 D:53; SCE IV:IA, fig. LXXXVI:7; Morris 1985, 230, pl. 261, with "Bakers's stick" motif. The incised zigzags are Morris 1985, 296, fig. 512, no. 84; Stewart 1988, 88–89, Type I B<sup>2</sup>i2.

# A.7. Jug, Type I B2i2. OUKL 2. Pl. 2.1.

H 27.5 cm, D 15.4 cm.

Handle mended. Most of rim missing. The surface is rather worn, and in patches the slip has disappeared.

The clay is brownish-buff. The slip is warm lustrous red. Globular body, narrow, cylindrical neck, flaring rim. Handle, rectangular in section, from neck to shoulder. At the

top of the handle a knob. On the body on both sides of the handle a small knob with a shallow depression in the middle. The transition between neck and body is marked by a ridge, and opposite the handle side there is another knob. There are two ridges on the neck above the handle, and three vertical, incised zigzags in the handle zone.

Red Polished III (MC I).

Strøm 1970, 89, fig. 1.

Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. LXXXVI:7; Stewart 1988, 88–89, Type I B<sup>2</sup>i2.

## A.8. Jug, Type I B1bd. OUKL 36. Pl. 2.2.

H 48.0 cm, D 31.0 cm.

Intact, except for minor chips of rim missing. The surface is very worn, and the slip has disappeared from large parts. The clay is reddish-brown. The slip is lustrous brownish-red with occasional patches of black and brownish-buff. Globular body, cylindrical neck with flat, flaring rim. Handle, round in section, from neck to shoulder. On the upper part of the handle three incised, parallel, horizontal strokes. Above these, on the transition to the neck, a round depression, 1 cm in D.

Red Polished III (EC IIIB – MC II).

Cf. Myres 1940–1945, pl. 27:1, bottom row:2–3, Lapithos Tomb 28; Stewart 1950, pl. XXXIII:d, Tomb 131 A:20 + pl. XXXVII, Tomb 139:43; *SCE* IV:IA, fig. LXXVI:9–14; Karageorghis 1974, 8, no. 48, pl. VI, CVI, Kition (Area I), Tomb 6:48; Stewart 1988, 64–65, Type I B<sup>1b</sup>d.

## A.9. Juglet. OUKL 41, Pl. 223.

H 12.5 cm, D 15.0 cm, D of mouth 4.0 cm.

Half of the rim is missing. The surface is very worn, and on the front side of the body a large fracture.

The clay is reddish-brown with larger particles. The slip is reddish-brown turning into brownish-buff.

Globular body, cylindrical neck with slightly flaring rim. Handle, rectangular in section, from neck to shoulder. On the handle there is a number of incised strokes filled with white. The incised decoration on the body consists of wavy lines in bands of five, running in a rather anarchistic way and covering the upper part of the body.

Hand-made Red Slip Ware.

For this ware see SCE IV:1B, 84–88. The shape is somewhat similar to SCE IV:1B, fig. XXII:8 (Black Slip I).

# **A.10.** Juglet, Type I A<sup>2</sup>g, var. a. OUKL 365. Pl. 2.4.

H 13.8 cm, D 8.3cm, D of mouth 3.5 cm.

Mended. The surface is very worn.

The clay is greyish-buff with darker particles. The slip is reddish-brown.

Globular body, slightly conical neck and broad, low cutaway mouth. Handle, oval in section, from rim to shoulder.

Red Polished III (EC III - MC I).

Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. LXVIII:1; Leipen 1966, 17, no. 16, no. 965.114.15; Stewart 1988, 34, Type I A<sup>2</sup>g, var. a.

# **A.11. Jug, Type I A<sup>2</sup>. OUKL 69. Pl. 2.5.**

H 18.4 cm, D 9.6 cm.

Intact. The slip has almost disappeared.

The clay is reddish and greyish-buff with darker particles; the juglet is misfired. The slip is reddish-brown.

Globular body ending in a small nipple. Narrow, slightly conical neck with cut-away rim. Handle, oval in section, from rim to shoulder; small knob at the base. On the upper part of the handle an incised, vertical stroke. On the shoulder, opposite the handle side, a knob.

Red Polished III.

Cf. SCE I, pl. XXXI:1, fourth row:19, Lapithos Tomb 316:98; SCE IV:IA, fig. LXIX:10 (without knob); CVA Danemark 1, Copenhague Mus. Nat. 1, II C, pl. 21:6 / Danemark 21/; CVA Deutschland 8, Karlsruhe 2, pl. 43:4 /Deutschland 341/; CVA Great Britain 11, Cambridge 2, II C; pl. VII:15 /Great Britain 486/.

# **A.12. Juglet, Type I A<sup>2</sup>s.** OUKL 70. Pl. 3.1.

H 12.4 cm, D 7.4 cm.

The top of the neck is broken off. The surface is very worn, and most of the slip has disappeared.

The clay is yellowish-buff. The slip is brownish-red. At the bottom a dark patch due to misfiring.

Globular body, cylindrical cut-away neck. Handle, round in section, from rim to shoulder. At the base of the neck, opposite the handle side, a knob.

Red Polished III (probably MC II).

Cf. SCE I, pl. XXVI, second row:9, Lapithos Tomb 313 B; SCE IV:IA, fig. LXIX:10; CVA Danemark 1, Copenhague Mus. Nat. 1, IIC, pl. 21:5 /Danemark 21/; Stewart 1988, 39, Type I A<sup>2</sup>s.

# A.13. Jug, Type I A2o3. OUKL 43. Pl. 3.2.

H 23.1 cm, D 12.6 cm.

Half of beak missing, the other half is mended. The slip has disappeared in large patches.

The clay is yellowish-buff with darker particles. The slip is brownish-buff.

Piriform body, slightly conical neck with high cut-away spout. Handle, oval in section, from rim to shoulder; on the back an incised, vertical, wavy line. At the base of the neck, opposite the handle side, a horizontally perforated knob.

Red Polished III-IV (MC I-II).

Cf. SCE I, pl. XXXI:1, fourth row:4, Lapithos Tomb 316:128, pl. XXXVII, second row:12, Lapithos Tomb 322 D:25, pl. XXXIX:4, second from the left, Lapithos Tomb 323 D:5; SCE IV:IA, fig. LXIX:3–5; Stewart 1988, 37, Type I A<sup>2</sup>o3.

## **A.14. Juglet, Type I A<sup>2</sup>z,f.** OUKL 85. Pl. 3.3.

H 14.0 cm, D 7.2 cm.

Intact, except for small chips of the rim.

The clay is yellowish-buff. The slip is reddish-brown turning into brownish-buff.

Gourd-shaped body, narrow cut-away neck. Handle, rectangular in section, from neck to shoulder. On each side of the neck, above the handle, two knobs with small holes on the side towards the handle; they are not perforated. On the upper part of the body, in the handle zone, there is an encircling incised decoration, 3 cm high: between two bands of three horizontal lines there is a triple wavy band. Red Polished III (MC I–II).

Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. LXX:8; Stewart 1988, 42, Type I A<sup>2</sup>z,f.

# **A.15.** Jug, Type I A<sup>3</sup>c, var. b. OUKL 60. Pl. 3.4. H 15.2 cm, D 9.0 cm.

Mended. The slip has almost entirely disappeared. At the bottom a patch of disintegration of the surface.

The clay is brownish-buff. The slip is reddish-brown.

Gourd-shaped body, narrow, cylindrical cut-away neck. Handle, oval in section, from neck to shoulder. The incised decoration covers the entire jug: on the handle a triple vertical zigzag in a band between two vertical lines. From the rim there are 6 x 3 oblique, parallel lines, and below a multiple zigzag between encircling, parallel lines. The body is divided horizontally into three zones by encircling bands of three lines. The upper and lower ones are decorated with horizontal multiple zigzags, and the middle one with six hatched triangles with three short, horizontal, parallel strokes in between. From the base of the handle to the bottom of the body there is a separate, vertical zone, bordered by bands of 4 lines, with a vertical, multiple zigzag.

Red Polished III (EC III and probably MC I). Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. LXXI:3; Stewart 1988, 45, Type I A<sup>3</sup>c, var. b.

## **A.16. Juglet, Type I B<sup>3</sup>c3.** OUKL 87. Pl. 3.5.

H 9.3 cm, D 5.8 cm, D of mouth 1.8 cm.

Intact, except for cracks and minor chips missing from the body.

The clay is brownish-buff. The slip is brownish-red, turning below the handle into yellowish and dark brown colours, creating a mottled effect.

Globular body, slightly conical neck with flaring lip. Handle, round in section, from rim to shoulder. The incised decoration on the neck consists of two pairs of encircling lines. A band starting from the base of the handle encircles the body at the base of the neck: between a lower straight and an upper zigzag line there are dots. Below the band, just opposite the handle side, a knob, and running downwards from this a vertical triple zigzag, consisting of strokes that do not meet at the apexes. Similar zigzags run down from both sides of the handle base. The decoration leaves the bottom free. Along the back of the handle one vertical zigzag.

Drab Polished Ware (MC).

Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. XCII:8. The shape and decoration point towards the South Coast Style (cf. Herscher 1976, pl. II:4 from Phaneromeni); Gehrig 1975, no. 8, possibly from Paphos; Morris 1985, 51, pl. 48a.

# **A.17. Juglet, Type I B**<sup>3</sup>**c1, var. a.** OUKL 88. Pl. 4.1. H 15.7 cm, D 10.5 cm.

Mended. Pieces of body and rim missing. The surface is very worn. The clay is yellowish-buff. The slip is warm, lustrous, brownish-red, with occasional black patches.

Gourd-shaped body, narrow, cylindrical neck and flaring rim. Handle, round in section, from rim to shoulder. The decoration is incised: around the body groups of concentric circles connected by multiple, parallel lines. On the neck two encircling bands of parallel lines.

Red Polished III (EC III – MC II; possibly also EC II). Cf. SCE I, pl. XXXVII:1, second row:3–4, Lapithos Tomb 322 D:61, 40; CVA Belgique 1, Mus. Roy. du Cinq. 1, II C, pl. 1:10 /Belgique 1/; CVA Great Britain 1, Brit. Mus. 1, II C a, pl. 3:21 /Great Britain 3/; Stewart 1950, pl. XXXII:c, Tomb 130:23 and pl. XLII:a, Tomb 157:3; SCE IV:IA, fig. XCI:16, XCII:6; Frankel 1983, 26–27, nos 80–81, pl. 6; Stewart 1988, 108–112, Type I B³c1, var. a. For the decoration see Morris 1985, 333, Type 17 a.

# **A.18. Juglet, Type I B**<sup>3</sup>**c1, var. a.** OUKL 89. Pl. 4.2.

H 14.5 cm, D 9.1 cm, D of mouth 4.6 cm.

The neck with the handle is broken and mended. The surface is very worn, and the slip has disappeared from large parts, especially on the neck.

The clay is yellowish-buff. The slip is lustrous brownish-red.

Gourd-shaped body, narrow, cylindrical neck and flaring rim. Handle, round in section, from rim, where it starts in a knob, to shoulder. The decoration is incised: around the body groups of concentric circles, linked by bands of three or four parallel lines. In the free fields double, horizontal zigzags in the lower ones, and in the upper ones two groups of opposite, diagonal lines. On the neck two groups of encircling lines, four below, three above. The bottom is without decoration.

Red Polished III (EC III – MC II; possibly also EC II). Cf. Stewart 1950, pl. XXXII:c, Tomb 130:23 and pl. XLII:a, Tomb 157:3, almost identical shape and decoration; *CVA* Roumanie 1, Bucarest 1, II C, pl. 1:7/Roumanie 1/; Stewart 1988, 108–112, Type I B³c1, var. a. For the same decorative system see *SCE* IV:1A., fig. XC:19, XCI:16, XCII:6, XCIII:5 and Morris 1985, 333, Type 17 b.

# **A.19. Juglet, Type I B3c1, var. a.** OUKL 90. Pl. 4.3.

H 11.4 cm, D 7.8 cm, D of mouth 3.9 cm.

Mended; small piece of rim missing. The surface is worn. The clay is reddish-buff. The slip is warm reddish-brown, turning into buff at the bottom.

Gourd-shaped, rather depressed body - the max. D is very low. Narrow, slightly conical neck and flaring lip. Handle, round in section, from rim to shoulder. On the neck two bands of incised, horizontal lines starting behind the handle. On the body, down to the max. D, four groups of antithetic pairs of eleven concentric semicircles, split by three vertical lines. Along the max. D four bands of five incised, horizontal lines between the pairs of circles. Above the

bands groups of seventeen horizontally placed, short strokes, superimposed by five longer, horizontal strokes. Just to the left of the central pair of semicircles, near the max. D, a single decorative element: a double zigzag consisting of strokes that do not meet at the apexes.

Red Polished III (EC III – MC II; possibly also EC II). Cf. . SCE I, pl. XCVIII:7, Lapithos Tomb 302 C:21; SCE IV:IA, fig. XC:11; Stewart 1988, 108–112, Type I B³c1, var. a. For the decoration see Stewart 1950, pl. LXVIII:b, Tomb 137:63 and Morris 1985, 335, Type 20 a.

# **A.20. Juglet, Type I B<sup>3</sup>c1, var. a.** OUKL 91. Pl. 4.4. H 11.6 cm, D 7.7, D of mouth 4.2 cm.

The neck with the handle is broken and mended. The surface is very worn, and the slip has disappeared in large patches.

The clay is yellowish-buff. The slip is lustrous reddish-brown.

Gourd-shaped body, narrow, cylindrical neck, flaring rim. Handle, round in section, from rim to shoulder. The body is vertically divided by groups of incised, parallel lines into five zones. These are filled by multiple, vertical zigzags, whose apexes do not meet. The bottom is undecorated. The lower part of the neck has an encircling band of four parallel lines, and just below the rim there is another band of three parallel lines. At the base of the handle five short, horizontal strokes, one on top of the other.

Red Polished III (EC III – MC II; possibly also EC II). Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. XC–XCI; Stewart 1988, 108–112, Type I B<sup>3</sup>e1, var. a.

# **A.21.** Juglet, Type I B<sup>3</sup>c1, var. a. OUKL 92. Pl. 5.1–2. H 11.1 cm, D 7.0 cm, D of mouth 2.7 cm.

Half of rim missing. The slip has disappeared here and there. Dark patches due to misfiring.

The clay is yellowish-buff. The slip is lustrous reddish-brown.

Gourd-shaped body, narrow, cylindrical neck, flaring rim. Handle, round in section, from rim to shoulder. Around the max. D of the body there is an incised encircling band of spirals linked by triple lines. The zone above is decorated with interchanging spirals and diamonds. The lower diamonds are merely diagonal strokes, while the upper ones consist of diagonal strokes with rows of dots in between. Situated irregularly between these figures there are zigzags, horizontal or oblique, and small clusters of four to six dots. The neck is horizontally divided into two zones by three bands of three parallel lines. The upper zone is decorated with a horizontal zigzag, the lower one with three dot-clusters. On the back of the handle three groups of vertical strokes: bottom, middle, top.

Red Polished III (EC III – MC II; possibly also EC II). Cf. SCE IV:IA, fig. XC–XCI; Stewart 1988, 108–112, Type I B<sup>3</sup>c1, var. a. For a similar decoration, see Morris 1985, pl. 56:c.

## A.22. Bottle, Type V B or C. OUKL 367. Pl. 5.3.

H 12.0 cm, D 7.7 cm.

Upper part of neck missing. Mended. The surface is blackened by fire.

The clay is greyish-buff, with minor lighter and darker particles. The slip is reddish-brown, turning into dark brown in large patches.

Rays around shoulder, and line around edge of carination. On upper part of body a lotus palmette chain, lower part of body and foot glazed except for three reserved lines on body and one on foot. Outside of handle glazed.

Attic, "the Haimon-Beldam Pattern lekythoi" (first half of 5th cent. B.C.).

Cf. Kurtz 1975, 152-153, pl. 69:2.

# C.5. Black-figure Lekythos. OUKL 411. Pl. 68.1-3.

H 17.5 cm, Max. D 5.5 cm, D of foot 4.5 cm, D of rim 3.2 cm.

Foot mended. Rim and foot chipped. Surface damaged and

part of decoration worn off.

Fine orange-buff clay, semi-lustrous glaze.

Rim glazed. On shoulder a frieze of buds below short rays. Below carination a band of dots with two lines below. On body a quadriga to the right and four figures. To the left a woman wrapped in a long mantle steps into the chariot. In front of her are two standing figures partly hidden by the horses. The woman wears a long dress and a mantle over her shoulders and the bearded man who looks back at her is dressed in a himation. Both carry a branch. In front of the horses and turned towards them a standing draped person. Between him and the horses a patch with incisions, perhaps part of a small animal. Traces of added white on the womens' hair and the face of the standing woman. A black line below the scene. Lower part of body glazed except for a reserved double band.

Attic, the Haimon Painter and his Group (c. 480 B.C.). Cf. Haspels 1936, 130–141; Beazley 1956, 538–539; Beazley 1971, 269–274.

## C.6. Black-figure Lekythos. OUKL 409. Pl. 68.4–6.

Preserved H 11.5 cm, Max. D 6.0 cm, D of foot 4.0 cm. Upper part of neck, rim and handle missing, surface worn. Fine light orange clay, semi-lustrous glaze.

On the shoulder a cock towards the right between two ivy leaves.

On the body a figure zone framed by encircling lines showing a warrior pursuing another warrior to the right between two mantle clad men with staffs turned towards them. The warrior to the right looks back at his pursuer. They are dressed in short chitons, carry helmets with crests, round shields and a spear. On the warrior to the right it is indicated by three lines. Lower part of body and foot except for the edge are glazed.

Attic, the Cock Group (c. 500 B.C.).

Cf. Haspels 1936, 67–68; Beazley 1956, 466–471; Beazley 1971, 209–210.

#### C.7. Black-figure Lekythos. OUKL 501. Pl. 69.1-2.

Preserved H 8.8 cm, Max. D 4.5 cm, D of foot 2.9 cm. Mended, upper part of neck, rim, upper part of handle, and part of foot missing.

Fine, light orange-red clay, lustrous black glaze, and added white.

On the shoulder a frieze of buds below rays. On the body a figure zone framed by encircling lines showing two warriors in combat between two mantle clad men with staffs turned towards them. The warrior to the left strides forwards to the right lifting his spear towards his opponent's shield. The point of the spear is indicated just in front of the shield, but a prolongation of the line may indicate that the spear has penetrated the waist of the warrior who thus hit sinks backwards with his lifted spear pointing towards the ground. Both are dressed in a short chiton with thorax and carry spears, crested helmets, swords and round shields.

A greave is indicated on the left leg of the right hand warrior. White dots decorate both shields, and white is added on the crest and chiton of the warrior to the left and on the mantle draped over the arm of the two spectators. Lower part of body and foot glazed.

Attic, the Little-Lion Class (c. 500 B.C.).

Cf. Haspels 1936, 98–99; 118; Beazley 1956, 512–514; Beazley 1971, 251–252.

## C.8. Floral Band Cup. OUKL 419. Pl. 69.3-5.

H 6.0 cm, D of foot 6.7 cm, D of rim 16.0 cm, D incl. handles: 21.0 cm.

Rim mended, fragment of rim missing, glaze chipped off on the inside.

Fine light orange-brown clay, on the exterior the black glaze has turned brownish-red at places.

Shallow bowl with plain rim. The foot has a slightly conical upper surface, and the handles rise to the height of the rim. Below the bottom a nipple. On the inside a large reserved tondo. The edge of the rim is painted. Between the handles a chain of palmettes (twelve to thirteen petals) each placed on an arch, alternating with lotus flowers. An ivy leaf under one of the handles. The frieze is bordered below by an encircling line. Glaze covers the underside of the handles, lower part of body, stem, and foot except for the edge.

Boeotian (second part of the 5th century B.C.). Cf. Maffre 1975, 506–508, nos 27–28, fig. 48–51; Maffre 1978, 278, no 5, fig. 7a–c.

# C.9. Floral Band Cup. OUKL 418. Pl. 70.1-3.

H 5.7 cm, D of foot 6.3 cm, D of rim 14.8 cm, D incl. handles: 21.2 cm.

Mended, fragments of rim missing.

Fine reddish-buff clay, black glaze turned reddish-brown. Shallow bowl with plain rim and short concave stem. The foot has a slightly conical upper surface, and the handles rise to a point just above the rim. A conical impression below the foot. On the inside a reserved tondo with a glazed circle and dot in the centre, and a reserved line below the rim. The edge of the rim is glazed. Between the handles a degenerate lotus palmette chain on a cable, bordered below by a line. Glaze covers the underside of the handles, lower part of the body, stem, outside of foot, and impression below the foot.

Attic or Boeotian (5th century B.C.).

For the shape cf. C.8 with further references. The decoration, however, is more reminiscent of cups from the Agora, see Vanderpool 1946, pl. LXII:218–221.

# C.10. Black-figure Cup. OUKL 420. Pl. 70.4-6.

H 5.2 cm, D of foot 6.4 cm, D of rim 16.4 cm.

One handle missing and rim chipped.

Fine orange-brown clay, black glaze turned brown on handles, lower part of body and on the inside.

Shallow bowl with plain rim, short straight, ribbed stem

and low conical foot. The handle rises to a point just above the rim. On the inside a reserved tondo. The edge of the rim is glazed. Between the handles on either side two figures framed by palmettes. Side A: Two satyrs moving towards each other holding drinking horns. Side B: Two figures walking to the right. In front a maenad holds a thyrsos, lifts up her long dress and looks back at the man, probably a satyr who follows her. The wavy line behind him probably indicates the tip of his tail and the stroke in front of him the lower part of his drinking horn. Glaze covers the underside of the handle, lower part of body, the stem, and the foot except for edge and resting surface. Boeotian (middle of 5th century B.C.).

# C.11. Red-figure Squat Lekythos. OUKL 415. Pl. 71.1. H 9.5 cm, Max. D 6.0 cm, D of base 4.5 cm, D of rim 3.2 cm

Large part of body damaged, part of foot missing. Fine light brown clay, glaze turned brown at places. The rim has an ogee curve, the neck is set off from body by a ridge, the base has a convex profile and the handle is

flat. On body a spotted fawn towards the right with a scroll under its raised front legs. Two reserved lines below.

Attic (late 5th to early 4th century B.C.).

# C.12. Columbus Alabastron. OUKL 416. Pl. 71.2.

H 7.1 cm, D of base 3.2 cm, D of rim 2.5 cm. Fragments of rim missing, glaze partially worn off. Fine light orange-brown clay, lustrous black glaze, and encircling red line on upper part of body. Attic (first half of 5th cent. B.C.).

#### C.13. Black-glazed Type C Cup. OUKL 417. Pl. 71.3.

H 8.2 cm, D of foot 7.7 cm, D of rim 16.0 cm.

Fragment of rim missing, glaze partially worn off.

Fine orange-buff clay, lustrous black glaze, fired red

Fine orange-buff clay, lustrous black glaze, fired red in places.

Shallow bowl, concave rim, and slightly concave stem with grooves scratched at transition to foot. Edge of foot and handle-panels reserved.

Attic (end of 6th c. or beginning of 5th c. B.C.). Cf. Sparkes & Talcott 1970, 91–92, pl. 19:411, Athenian agora.

C.14. Black-glazed Acrocup. OUKL 422. Pl. 71.4.

H 8.6 cm, D of base 6.8 cm, D of rim 11.8 cm, incl. handles: 18.3 cm.

Mended, fragment of body missing.

Fine orange-brown clay, lustrous black glaze.

Deep bowl with rising foot and outturned rim.

Attic (probably second quarter of 5th century B.C.).

Cf. Bloesch 1940, 141–144, pl. 39:2 "die Akropolisgruppe"; Sparkes & Talcott 1970, 96, pl. 20:442, Athenian agora.

C.15. Black-glazed Lidded Lekanis. OUKL 421. Pl. 71.5. Bowl H 5.5 cm, D of foot 6.5 cm, D of rim 14.8 cm, D incl. handles: 21.0 cm.

Bowl and lid mended, fragments of lid missing.

Fine orange-brown clay, matt black glaze.

Shallow bowl with ring foot with broad, resting surface, flange for lid, horizontal ribbon handles. Shallow lid with short slightly concave stem, flanged knob with flat top with hollow cone in centre. Reserved: Inside of lid, resting surface, an encircling line on outside and edge of knob.

Attic (second part of the 5th century B.C.).

The bowl and the lid may not originally belong together. For the bowl see Sparkes & Talcott 1970, 165f., but the handles of C.15 do not have returns. For the lid see Sparkes & Talcott 1970, 167.

#### C.16. Bowl. OUKL 402. Pl. 71.6.

H 4.7 cm, D of base 6.0 cm, D of rim 11.6 cm.

Fragment of rim missing.

Fine reddish-brown clay, brownish-black slip.

Shallow bowl with incurving rim and ring foot. Slip covers the interior and exterior except for foot.

(Late Classical - Hellenistic).

Cf. Hellström 1965, 74–75, nos 337, 352, 357, pl. 17–18.

# C.17. Black-glazed plate. OUKL 354. Pl. 72.1-2.

H 3.1 cm, D of base 6.5 cm, D of rim 17.5 cm.

Buff clay, matt black glaze covering the inside and rim on worn off on top of rim.

Mended, fragments of base missing, the glaze is partially outside.

High ring foot, rolled rim with groove below on in- and outside, on floor circular depression with nipple. (Hellenistic).

For a similar shape see Goldman 1950, 213, no. 39, fig. 120, 179.

# C.18. Black-glazed Kantharos. OUKL 423. Pl. 72.3.

H 8.5 cm, H incl. handles: 11.6 cm, D of foot 5.0 cm, D of rim 8.9 cm.

Fine orange-brown clay, matt black glaze.

Chips of rim missing, spots of glaze flaked off.

Torus ring foot, straight stem, vertical strap handles rising above the rim.

Boeotian (third quarter of the 5th century B.C.).

Cf. Ure 1927, 36, type A; Gehrig 1975, no 107.

#### C.19. Black-glazed Hydria. OUKL 425. Pl. 72.4-5.

H 23.5 cm, D of base 6.3 cm, D of rim 8.2 cm.

One horizontal handle missing, surface damaged.

Fine orange-brown clay, semi-lustrous glaze.

Projected rim grooved on the outer edge, concave neck, ovoid body with carination and slightly sloping shoulder, fillet between body and foot. Torus foot concave on the upper side and with concave mouldings.

Egg-pattern on rim, and around neck an olive wreath with a string of berries above in added clay.

Attic (c. 350 B.C.).

Cf. Kopcke 1964, 35, no. 74, Beilage 23:2.

# C.20. Hare-shaped Vase. OUKL 6. Pl. 73.1-2.

H 19.5 cm.

Part of the rim, the left foreleg, and the right paw missing. Light brown micacious clay, light brown slip, black and dark red paint.

The hare is represented as dead suspended from the rim in its front legs. Its head and big ears hang down along its back, and its hind legs are streched. Black dots cover its back, breast, neck, limbs and edge of ears. The eyes are painted in outline with a central dot and the muzzle is indicated with a cross. The tail is black and the ears are red. Radiating black strokes on top of rim.

Etruscan (c. 575 B.C.)

Ginge 1981 with other references.

## C.21. Enthroned Female: vase. OUKL 4. Pl. 73.3-4.

H 13.7 cm.

Lower part mended, fragments missing, nose chipped off. Light brown clay.

The woman sits frontally with hands resting on her knees and feet supported by a foot stool. She is dressed in a long chiton with sleeves reaching to the elbows and a mantle drawn up above her head like a veil. It falls down along her shoulders and body with a bundle of pleats hanging down from each knee. The back of the throne reaches to the height of her shoulders.

East Greek (later half of 6th century B.C.).

Cf. CVA Deutschland 9, München 3, pl. 150:5-6 / Deutschland 432/; Ducat 1966, 66 "série samienne I, femmes assises".

# C.22. Crouching dwarf: vase. OUKL 3. Pl. 73.5-6.

H 13.5 cm.

Chips of rim and head of figure missing.

Orange-brown clay, traces of red slip.

Naked, fat man standing with bent knees and hands clasped under his protruding stomach. His face is fleshy, and his hair falls down onto his back where it is cut off in a straight line.

East Greek (late 6th century B.C.).

Cf. Cesnola 1882, 267–268, fig. 258, said to come from Kition; Higgins 1954, 56–57, nos 86, 89–92, pl. 18; Ducat 1966, 67, "série samienne I, nains assis au gros ventre".
