## Ad 1) Short messages by the head of department

- a) Faith Ellen was presented as a new member of staff.
- b) Two PhD students for Michele Della Morte (MDM) Fabio Vandin (FV) are on their way to IMADA. This will bring the department up to 9½ PhD students in this STÅ year, with the original goal being 2½ PhD students. Two more PhD students are also on their way, but have been put on hold while the possibility of transferring funds from one of the other departments is being considered.
- c) The accreditation panel has visited SDU. Martin Svensson (MS) met with them in The Educational Council. Representatives of both students and study boards also met with the panel. . The discussions were very positive. In week 16 it will be decided what themes will be chosen for the audit trails.
- d) SOS invites to a Marie Curie Master Class. Names of interested candidates should be given to MS. Deadline was the day of the departmental meeting.

### Ad 2) Mutual information

- a) The intake for the mathematics-economics degree was discussed. According to Bjarne Toft (BT) it is not the intake that courses problems but the large dropout rate. It is difficult to change, since the same degree at The University of Copenhagen (KU) has restricted admission and at SDU all students who apply can be enrolled. Students who get a rejection from KU often apply here instead, which gives SDU a group of students with lower grades, who live in Copenhagen and who will switch to Copenhagen if they get the chance. It is not an easy task to keep them at SDU.
- b) Kim Skak Larsen (KSL) is the new chairman for external examiners in computer science in Denmark. The new list with external examiners can be seen on KSL's website. MS asked that the mathematicians should be aware of the new list in mathematics as well.
- c) Joan Boyar informed that the master level courses which IMADA recently applied to have preapproved as PhD courses have all been approved.
