Apostrophes

Purpose of the apostrophe: to show possession or ownership.

Apostrophes are also used in contractions (he is \rightarrow he's, we are \rightarrow we're), but these are not used in academic writing (unless you are transcribing someone's spoken words).

RULES FOR PLACING APOSTROPHES TO SHOW POSSESSION

1. Singular nouns add 's

- ☑ The <u>patient's</u> attitude was positive. 未
- \square They followed the <u>doctor's</u> advice.
- ✤ If a name already ends in s, add just add the apostrophe (')
- \square We documented <u>Mr. Jones'</u> experience.

*Note Apostrophes are typically used when referring to people rather than objects.

- \square The <u>girl's</u> parents gave written consent.
- \square The expiration date <u>of the blood</u> was unknown.
- In the <u>blood's</u> expiration date was unknown.

2. Regular plural nouns just add '

- ☑ The <u>patients'</u> records were found in the database. (many patients)
- ☑ The <u>families'</u> visiting hours were limited the first week of the clinical trial. (many families)

3. Irregular plural nouns add 's

e.g. man-men, child-children, woman-women, people (already plural)

\rightarrow men's, women's, children's

- ☑ The children's ward served as a model for other hospitals.
- \square She argued that the men's uniforms were outdated.

Note:

Do not use an apostrophe for dates: In the $\frac{1980's}{3} \rightarrow$ in the 1980s

or to make an acronym plural:

Both MRI's showed identical results. \rightarrow Both MRIs showed identical results.
