## Information on visiting PhD students at the Department of Law, University of Southern Denmark

The Department of Law at the University of Southern Denmark welcomes international and national visiting PhD students.

Please see the following conditions and guidelines for a visit:

- 1. Visiting PhD students are expected to have an academic contact person at the Department of Law, either an associate professor or a professor.
- 2. Visiting PhD students will be associated with one of the department's four research groups or the department's Centre for Law, Sustainability & Justice.
- 3. Visiting PhD students are invited to participate in all academic activities at the Department of Law, e.g. seminars and guest lectures.
- 4. Visiting PhD students will not be enrolled in a doctoral programme. However, the Department might be able to assist visiting students in getting access to relevant PhD courses offered through the Danish <u>JurForsk</u> programme and to get ECTS certificates for participating in these courses.
- 5. Visiting PhD students pay no tuition fees.
- 6. Visiting PhD students are normally offered an office space at the Department of Law. The office will be shared with one or two colleagues.
- 7. Visiting PhD students will have access to the university library and IT facilities.
- 8. Supervision and academic guidance must be agreed upon prior to the stay. Please contact the Department's PhD coordinator regarding this.
- 9. The Department of Law offers no grant, salary, accommodation or other benefits. Visiting students are, however, welcome to contact the university's international office as well as the accommodation office.
