Programme: Pre-workshop evening: In an informal get-together on Wednesday

evening, participants had the chance to get to know each other and to

exchange first thoughts on research connections and ideas.

Workshop day 1: After a welcome, the day was organized with three more formal presentations: (i) Christopher Schlaegel presented a meta-analysis that identifies the associations between cultural intelligence (CQ) and different work related outcomes*; (ii) Linn van Dyne

presented a paper on the bi-factor theory of the four-factor model of CQ

and discussed recent research on CQ and its future research

implications**; and (iii) Günter Stahl presented a project that provides an overview of the research landscape on determinants of integration

success of migrants into the workplace and society***.

The formal presentations were followed by an open discussion in which participants were able to ask questions and to discuss issues and concepts related to the three presentations. The focus was particular on the connection between the three presentations/topics. The discussion was closed by an identification of interest areas for day 2 (see preliminary workshop programme for further details).

Workshop day 2: After a welcome, all participants took part in a "Worldcafé" in that three groups subsequently discussed research questions related to three interest areas identified in day 1: determinants and development of CQ, team-level (outcomes of) CQ, and CQ and integration success of migrants. The individual sessions were each hosted by one of the research network members who summarized the outcomes of the three sessions afterwards.

Thereafter, the workshop was formally closed, yet there was time offered for informal networking between individual workshop members which was strongly used during the afternoon.

Outcomes:

Publication projects agreed:

Agreement on a joint publication project on migrants between several core network members (Hauff/Richter) involving a survey to be performed in Germany and a paper draft to be submitted to a special issue of the Human Resources Management Journal "The role of HRM in refugee workforce integration – Advancing theory and enhancing practice".

Agreement to cooperate in the analysis of data in the project EUDIM (on integrating migrants) between Günter Stahl and two of SDU's thesis candidates (supervised by Nicole Franziska Richter).

The network members offered Günter Stahl to perform as national survey partners in the global migrant project he is leading with different international partners (outcome is still open).

Agreement on meetings between two teams of co-authors of the two meta-analysis related to CQ: Rockstuhl/van Dyne and Schlaegel/Richter/Taras to identify potential areas for cooperation on the current meta-analysis presented by Christopher Schlaegel.
