

MCI's Open Science Policy

In general, MCI follows SDUs open science policy

The institute council has in February 2025 decided that the following points are of special importance for research at MCI:

- Research data is recognised as a valuable resource and a Data Management Plan (DMP) is considered as an essential part of any major research project.
- It should follow the FAIR (Findable, Accessible, Interoperable, Reusable) principles and adhere to the Danish Code of Conduct for Research Integrity.
- Information and research data are kept as closed as it is necessary and as open as it is sensible.
- Appropriate formats are selected, and appropriate arrangements are made for the long-term preservation of scholarly output.
- The research data needed to validate the results presented in scientific publications are deposited in trusted repositories for at least 5 years with information on how access can be gained.
- All researchers are urged to create an Open Researcher and Contributor ID (ORCID) and to connect researcher IDs to Pure.
