DESCRIPTION

Stated preference and choice methods have become one of the mainstream methods in of environmental and resource management, where they are applied by economists, policy analysts, market researchers and many other disciplines. Over the past decade, applying these stated preference methods has become easier with relevant software and text books now readily available, while at the same time new techniques for design and analysis are continuously improved.

This course will provide an introduction to these methods for PhD and advanced masters students with limited prior exposure to these techniques. It will approach the topic with a mix of theoretical / conceptual lectures and hands-on assignments and lab-exercises. The course will

- provide the conceptual and econometric foundations to stated preference and choice methods;
- introduce the concepts of statistical designs;
- provide an overview to questionnaire design and question writing;
- explore the various types of models used for analysis (logit, probit, nested logit, mixed logit, etc.)
- introduce students to the various types of analysis with actual data sets in the lab.

Examples will be drawn from studies in environmental valuation and consumer research and other relevant topics.
