Welcome to all and welcome to Esben Flindt from SDU RIO.

Research support, SDU RIO/ Esben Flindt

RIO can offer classical, organizational and political support, national and international, and support to applications to Funds. RIO support researchers across the Faculties. Support to find money to small events, ex. workshops, not big events as a conference.

Options for the Steering Group could be to talk about funding opportunities and basic collaborations across faculties.

One of the biggest barriers for large funding applications is to establish the best team. RIO has a matchmaking tool that can lead to collaborations across the Faculties. This is a good way to share our knowledge and could be a useful exercise for the Arctic Network at SDU.

The Steering Group will discuss the need to arrange a workshop with SDU RIO with a specific focus on Arctic collaboration across SDU. SDU RIO can also map publications and collaborations as they look now to inspire the focus of the network.
