## PREVIOUS STUDIES:

- **SCOT** (phase IV trial, 2,209 randomised in Denmark), Standard care vs Celecoxib Outcomes Trial. Randomised trial of celecoxib vs traditional NSAID in regard to development of thrombosis. A pragmatic trial in general practice
- **FAST** (phase IV trial, 1,900+ randomised in Denmark), Febuxostat vs Allopurinol Streamlined Trial. Randomised trial of allopurinol vs febuxostat in regard to development of thrombosis. A pragmatic trial in general practice.
- **Compose** (phase III trial), randomised trial for evaluating the safety of naldemedine for treatment of opioid-induced constipation. The trial is carried out in general practice and hospitals.
- **Agomelatine**, large multinational trial based on data from health registers to evaluate the risk of liver damage when using agomelatine, a newer anti-depressant.
