Open Science?

Open Science is to practice science in such a way that others can collaborate and contribute easily because the research data, lab notes, methods and research processes are freely available under specific terms that enable reuse, redistribution and reproduction of the research.

Setting the default to 'Open' for research

The world of scholarly research is changing. Researchers are now expected to be more transparent, collaborative, and open about their work. The development in Open Science is all about transforming the ways in which traditional research is performed and communicated.
