How to write a competitive grant proposal (English version)

The course targets and will be beneficial for researchers at all career stages, but with main focus on early-career fundraising options (PhD student to assistant-professor level). The purpose of this course is to train participants in efficient grant proposal writing, and to provide a deeper understanding of the factors affecting the success of a grant proposal, both in Denmark and internationally.

The core activity of the course is for each participant to develop a competitive research grant proposal.

Funding opportunities

International Network Programme (INP)

Call for proposals for bilateral network activities in R&D with China, India, Israel, Japan, USA, Brazil and the Republic of Korea.

<u>The INP</u> is aimed at giving researchers from both the public and the private sector an opportunity to establish networks and cooperation with researchers from countries that the Danish Agency for Science, Technology and Innovation has bilateral agreements with.

Grants are given to projects where there is not already a well-established connection between the project partners and for the following activities:

- Scientific workshops and conferences with participation of researchers, scientists, research experts and PhD-students from Denmark and from one or more of the selected countries.
- Travel between Denmark and the selected countries in order to identify potential for new projects and partnerships.

Ten million DKK has been reserved for this call. Each application can only be supported up to max 200.000 DKK, excl. OH.

• The Maritime Fund

The purpose of <u>The Maritime Fund</u> is to strengthen and develop the shipping and ship building industries with the aim of creating new jobs and strengthening the companies in the industry. The Maritime Fund has a yearly budget of app. DKK 50m for co-financing the development of novel products and technologies.

• The Danish Innovation Foundation - Call for Advanced Technology Projects The overall objective of an Advanced Technology Project must be, within a

The overall objective of an Advanced Technology Project must be, within a specified time limit after the end of the funding period, a completely new product or a new generation of products through use of advanced technology. Focus on realizing market potentials by transforming advanced technology to value added. Can support the following:

- Projects with partnership between at least one Danish private company and at least one Danish public sector research institution.
- Innovation projects in which the project's various parts, methods, approaches, etc. are known, but their combination is novel.
- Advanced technology projects with large-scale research activities, as the product aimed for cannot be developed without considerable research effort.

- Required co-financing model: public sector party contributes 1/6; the private party by 2/6; and InnovationsFonden contributes 3/6 of the total budget. The Foundation's share may increase if one or more of the project partners are Small and Medium Sized Enterprises (SME).
- 2-4 years funding period.
- Applications can be made for an amount of 2,5-15 mio. DKK.

Fabrikant Mads Clausens Fond

This is a general charitable foundation supporting the following:

- purchasing of equipment for use in education and science (favorably in relation to Danfoss' products, production or employees)
- stimulation of interest in science among children and young people
- equipment for medical treatment

The foundation supports a project one time only, and the support is mainly given to projects that can make a difference for many people. The grants usually amounts to more than 25.000 DKK, however rarely more than 100.000 DKK. The foundation does not support medical research, private individuals, travel and subsistence expenses, conferences (unless of special interest to Danfoss), salaries, small investments, and long-term research projects.

EUDP

The purpose of EUDP is to exploit and develop the Danish business potential within the energy sector, as well as reaching a number of political goals including supply security, a cleaner environment, and cost efficiency. The energy technological development and demonstration program (EUDP) has a yearly budget of app. 250M DKK for co-financing the development and demonstration of new and effective energy technologies.

Deadline: September 4, 2014

ForskVE - Renewable Energy

With support from ForskVE – Renewable Energy you will be able to conduct projects promoting the availability of electricity power plants with some production capacity based on renewable energy. This year, the fund has a budget of DKK 25m for project support. The projects should seek to increase the availability of electricity power plants with a limited capacity. Support is given to demonstration, market maturation and dissemination projects. With a successful application to the program, companies will receive DKK 0.5-25m in project support.

• ForskEL – Electricity

With support from ForskEL – Electricity you will be able to conduct research, development and demonstration projects aimed at developing and implementing environmentally friendly electricity production technologies. This includes the development of an environmentally friendly and secure electricity supply. With a successful application to the program, companies will receive DKK 0.5-30m for technology and product development. The purpose of ForskEL – Electricity is to increase European competitiveness and create new jobs.

Development Research Projects, Phase 1

The Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs now invites for Phase 1 applications, 2015 for research grants related to development research. The Call is available at http://dfcentre.com/research/calls-for-applications/. It covers both North Driven Development Research Projects (for applicants from Denmark) and South Driven Development Research Project (for applicants from Ghana, Tanzania, and Nepal). Please note that the final prioritization process (Phase 2) of this Call will take place in 2015, so that the selected projects can start in 2016.

OECD's Co-operative Research Programme (CRP) on biological resources in agriculture

Calls for proposals to <u>Research Fellowships and Conference Sponsorship</u> within one of the 3 following research themes:

- The Natural Resources Challenge
- Sustainability in Practice

Research Fellowship

Sponsorship of scientists to conduct research projects in a different Member country with a view to strengthening the international exchange of ideas and increasing international mobility and co-operation. CPR supports transportation and subsistence costs to research scientists who have completed their postdoctoral training, have a permanent position, and are from Member countries to conduct research in a laboratory in another Member country. Fellowships may be from March 2015 and last from 6 to 26 weeks.

- Conference Sponsorship

co-sponsorship of international conferences, workshops, symposia, congresses, with a view to informing policy makers, industry and the academic world of current and future research, scientific developments and opportunities on issues

relevant to the CRP and the OECD's policy priorities. Eligible costs are expenses for invited speakers (travel and subsistence costs).

Marie Skłodowska-Curie: Individual Fellowships (IF)

Individual Fellowships provide opportunities to acquire and transfer new knowledge and to work on research in a European context (EU Member States and Associated Countries) or outside Europe. The scheme particularly supports the return and reintegration of researchers from outside Europe who have previously worked here. It also develops or helps to restart the careers of individual researchers that show great potential, considering their experience.

Support is foreseen for individual, trans-national fellowships awarded to the best or most promising researchers for employment in EU Member States or Associated Countries, based on an application made jointly by the researcher and host organisation in the academic or non-academic sectors.

Deadline: September 11, 2014 at 5PM, Brussels local time

DanStem National Collaboration Initiative

The Danish Stem Cell Center (DanStem) at the University of Copenhagen invites researchers and research groups at other Danish Universities and Research Institutions to apply for collaborative projects. The projects are supported by the Novo Nordisk Foundation Section for Basic Stem Biology through a donation from the Novo Nordisk Foundation. The aim of the call is to strengthen and develop basic research within the stem cell and developmental biology areas in Denmark through the establishment of genuine national collaborations based on concrete research projects at a high scientific level. Industrial postdoc projects (Erhvervspostdoc)

An <u>industrial postdoc</u> project is collaboration between companies and public research institutions concerning the solving of specific research and development tasks.

The purpose of an industrial postdoc project is:

- To give the industrial postdoc an opportunity in his/her career development to increase his/her overall level of competence in a unique way by combining research skills with experiences and mindset from working in a private company.
- To give the company the opportunity to solve specific research and development tasks, while also strengthening its relations with existing and new partners in the university environment.

- To strengthen the public sector research institution's relations with private companies, while simultaneously creating new opportunities for novel research areas.

The industrial postdoc program is targeting talented researchers in the beginning of their career, i.e. within a maximum of three years (excl. maternity/paternity leave) after obtaining the PhD degree. Industrial postdoc projects are individual projects of 1-3 years duration applied for by the postdoc candidate. The project is financed by the parties according to the Foundation's 1-2-3 model based on the principle that all parties contribute their own share of co-funding. In addition to this, the company and the research institution each provide a mentor, who acts as a sparring partner for the industrial postdoc.

The Canon Foundation in Europe

Calls for applications for grants to Research Fellowships to Japan to highly qualified European and Japanese researchers. Applicants are required to have obtained a PhD or M.Sc. degree within the previous ten years. Fellowships are awarded regardless of research discipline and existing employment positions. European Fellows pursue a period of research in Japan and Japanese Fellows at host institutions in Europe. The financial support for Research Fellows ranges from 22,500 Euro to 27,500 Euro per year, and are awarded for periods of at least 3 months up to max. 12 months. Nordic Innovation Programme – Nordic Built

Nordic Built is a joint Nordic initiative of the Nordic ministers for trade and industry to accelerate Nordic competitive concepts for a sustainable built environment.

The following types of projects can obtain funding through this call for proposals:

- New sustainable building or refurbishment concepts
- New innovative and sustainable business models for new buildings and for refurbishment of existing buildings
- Projects that generally promote the Nordic Built Charter or generally promote Nordic cooperation within sustainable building

For a project to receive funding under this call for proposals, these basic eligibility criteria (among others) must be met:

- The project must include partners form at least three Nordic countries with a reasonable balance between the different nations.
- No more than 50% of the budget can come from public funding

Deadline: October 15, 2014

LIFE Action Grants

The LIFE Regulation on the establishment of the Programme for Environment and Climate Action, sets a budget for the next funding period, 2014-2020, of 3.4 billion Euro. The Commission invites legal persons (entities) registered in the European Union (EU) to present proposals for the 2014 <u>Call for proposals for LIFE Action Grants</u>. The call covers proposals for both LIFE sub-programmes.

Deadline: medio October, 2014 (please find the specific deadlines for the different programmes in the call)
