Research stays at elite American Universities 2018 2019	Now you can apply for PhD and research stays in 2018 and 2019 at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and selected research environments at SUNCAT Catalysis Research Center at Stanford University and CITRIS at Berkeley University. The board for Research and Education also offers a travel scholarship of 15,000 kr. It is possible to send applications to DAFSHE throughout 2018. All applications will be assessed by the respective US-university and suitable applicants will be offered a scholarship on the first come first served basis. DAFSHE reserves the right to close the call for applications when allocated visiting months have been occupied or the funding for a travel grant has been used.
	The scholarships are part of an agreement between DAFSHE and the three American universities. The purpose of the agreement is to establish an exchange of knowledge between Danish and American universities and science environments and thus support the Danish institutions' ability to establish international networks and cooperation with the best research institutions in the world. International Network Program- 10 <sup>th</sup> call Deadline: May 16, 2018 at 12:00	International Network Programme (INP). This is the 10 <sup>th</sup> call. The aim of the programme is to give researchers an opportunity to build the foundation for future cooperation and to explore new research partnerships of a potentially high value. Please note, that this programme does not support projects where contact between the partners has already been established. Although the network activities can include participation of PhD students, post docs and assistant professors, the main applicant should be an associate or full professor.
	Grants may be awarded to projects between researchers from Denmark and one or more of the following <b>selected countries</b> : China (incl. Hong Kong), India, Israel, Japan, USA, Brazil, Turkey, South Africa and the Republic of Korea. For applications with an Arctic focus, partner countries, may also include Canada, Russia, Finland, Iceland, Norway, Sweden, Greenland and/or the Faroe Islands

	<ul> <li>Researchers can apply for up to 200.000 DKK excl. overhead for up to two years. Funding can be used for organization and execution of scientific workshops and conferences with participation of researchers from Denmark and one or more from the selected countries. Travel between Denmark and the selected countries in order to identify the potential for new projects and partnerships. Accommodation and meals can also be covered by the grant. Funding cannot be used to cover expenses for salaries or fees, i.e. speaker fees, PhD fees, tuition fees, fees for conferences, student assistance and costs related to publications etc.</li> <li>The project must begin in 2019 and be completed within a period of maximum two years. The start date of the project can be 1 January 2019 at the earliest. The completion date must be 31 December 2020 at the latest. See more information on</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>b) Development, test and demonstration projects, and</li> <li>c) Green Innovation Fund.</li> <li>The three pools together provide both small and large companies with good opportunities to apply for projects for development, testing and demonstration of new environmental technology solutions.</li> <li>Applications can be submitted in 2018 in all areas covered by MUDP, including water and climate adaptation, circular economy and recycling of resources in the waste, cleaner air, chemistry, soil, sustainable construction and less noise. Marie Skłodowska- Curie Actions – Individual Fellowships Call opens: April 12, 2018 Deadline: September 12, 2018	The goal of MSCA-Individual Fellowships is to enhance the creative and innovative potential of experienced researchers, wishing to diversify their individual competence in terms of skill acquisition through advanced training, international and intersectoral mobility. Individual Fellowships provide opportunities to acquire and transfer new knowledge and to work on research and innovation in a European context (EU Member States and Associated Countries) or outside Europe. The scheme particularly supports the return and reintegration of researchers from outside Europe who have previously worked here. It also develops or helps to restart the careers of individual researchers that show great potential, considering their experience. The Fellowship is based on an application made jointly by the researcher and the beneficiary/host in the academic or non-academic sector.Read more here
Call for new COST Actions Next collection date is expected to be April 25, 2018 12:00	COST Actions are a flexible, fast and efficient networking instrument for researchers, engineers and scholars to cooperate and coordinate nationally funded research activities. COST Actions allow European researchers to jointly develop their own ideas in any science and technology field. COST Actions are bottom-up science and technology networks, open to researchers and stakeholders with a duration of four years. They are active through a range of networking tools, such as workshops, conferences, training schools and dissemination activities. COST does not fund research itself. COST prides in its support for high-risk, innovative and emerging research themes. However, COST does not set any research priorities. The minimum number of countries included in the network has increased to seven COST Full or Cooperating Members. Out of the seven, a minimum of three must be Inclusiveness Target Countries. The call for ERC Advanced Grant opens on May 17 2018 with an application deadline on August 30 2018.
