International Undergraduate Exchange Programme – Sociology

Profile

The International Undergraduate Exchange Programme in Sociology offered at Campus Esbjerg takes place in the autumn semester starting on the 1st of September and contains a range of courses from the bachelor programmes in Sociology and Business administration running at the campus. Besides the Sociology exchange program the campus also offers an exchange programme in Environmental and Ressource Management.

The exchange programmes have been running for many years and students from Europe, North America and Asia have attended.

Why choose an International Undergraduate Exchange Programme in Sociology?

Common themes in the programme are cultural aspects of organizations, leisure and human rights. In all courses practical application of general theories and methods will be emphasized and in many of the courses, project work plays an important role.

The courses in the International Undergraduate Exchange Programmes combine theory and practice to ensure a solid theoretical basis and practical tools employable at your home university and later in your first job.

The courses consist of a combination of group work, project work and lectures. The classes are relatively small in regards to number of students, allowing for interaction with the professors lecturing as well as discussions among students. This is beneficial for your professional development as it enlarges the size of the active vocabulary which you can later use in discussing issues related to these fields as a part of your job.

Finally, you broaden your horizon because you meet and cooperate with students from other cultures as well as from other studies.

Campus Esbjerg is a part of the University of Southern Denmark. The campus is situated in green surroundings close to the town centre of Esbjerg (a city with app. 80,000 inhabitants) which offers cultural, sporting and leisure activities, and a lively nightlife.

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Entry requirements

- To follow courses at bachelor level you must have completed at least one year of studies (i.e., 60 ECTS).
- You must meet the entry requirements of the courses you wish to follow. You find the entry requirements in the description of the relevant courses.
- You must have English skills compared to the Danish B level in English. Exchange students can document it as follows:
As an EU/EEA, Nordic or Swiss citizen, you can document it by way of an upper intermediate level in English through your secondary school diploma (min. 210 hours at high school level), or an IELTS score of min 6.5 or a TOEFL of min 575/230/88.
Applicants with a non-EU/EEA, Nordic or Swiss citizenship must document their English skills with a TOEFL or an IELTS test.
